

QCT Board Meeting, 27 March 2020:

Outcomes summary

The Board's second meeting for the year was held using videoconferencing technology, due to the COVID-19 pandemic restrictions regarding physical distancing. The Board:

- endorsed a proposal that the office explore opportunities to optimise the QCT's financial position, given the increasing financial pressure on the organisation
- endorsed an amendment to the membership of the Internal Review Committee as specified in the Committee Charter
- suggested the Internal Review Committee continue to use its current process for certification reviews, refining this as necessary during this year, rather than adopting potential alternative processes
- approved updated delegations regarding the assessment of suitability to teach on applications for renewal of registration or permission to teach and the cancellation of conditions on a teacher's registration or a person's permission to teach
- resolved to write to the Minister to ask her to authorise the QCT's release of the 2020 data for the Australian Teacher Workforce Data project
- resolved that the evaluation and reporting requirements for committees as specified in the Committee Charter be amended to better align with committees' practice
- endorsed proposed actions regarding the Highly Accomplished Teachers and Lead Teachers certification project
- endorsed a proposal for high level stakeholder consultation about the issues and considerations relating to additional pathways into the teaching profession that may be suitable in Queensland
- noted reports from the Chair and Director and updates on various other activities and aspects
 of the QCT's work
